Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,



As I prepare to leave I wanted to make sure to point

out Nahant

Village Church (NVC) has many of the ingredients needed to revitalize, grow and animate the Body of Christ. Good things, God soaked things can happen here. Proof can be found in the many things we've done. As I detailed last month, we have done a lot! While I referred to financial concerns last month I want to also point out some good financial things. In 2023 pledging units increased by 29% and the amount of pledges went up at least 17% and by the end of that year NVC realized a gain of \$117, 945. In 2023 there was a great deal of generosity, over \$90,000 in gifts/pledges and there has been almost \$50,0000 so far this year. Those are wonderful blessings that most churches rarely, if ever, experience. The accomplishments and blessings of resources add up to so much promise that I continue to believe in this church and encourage you to do so too.

The good work the church accomplished over the past nineteen months involved a lot of you. Most of the work was headed up by committees and I want to give a nod of thanks to those who served on committees. This includes Marrit. Rex, Rich, Amy, Cal, Dave, Carl, Chris R., Bill C., Bill T., Nancy C., Nancy E., Nancy A., Robin, Flo, Beth, Elizabeth, Lynn, Lisa, Ute and Linda. Two leaders on committees and almost every work crew that I have not yet mentioned were Jen and Chris. Those two need a category all their own, I think of them as "Church Angels." Month in and month out Jen and Chris did whatever needed doing. They have supported every activity and our ministry together. They are exceptional servants of God and a blessing.

Another blessing is this church's decades of membership in the United Church of Christ. Deriving more than its IRS non-profit status from UCC membership, NVC has also received much help from the UCC, and it's reputation is great especially in MA. I note that historically when this church thrived the most, under Rev. Swansburg, it was very involved in the UCC. I tried to move us back to that involvement. In this time of people leaving church the UCC offers a progressive Christianity that can draw new members in and churches to grow. I am grateful to the UCC for all it has done and continues to do for NVC.

As we prepare to leave Nancy and I

have provided a modest gift of a blown up canvas version of a beautiful photo I took of the church in the spring (to match the one we gave showing winter). I titled the photo "The Ruby of Nahant with Blossoms." I think of that picture as a metaphor for the potential of this church to fully blossom. The church is blessed with many of the ingredients needed to blossom, more so in many respects than most churches these days. My prayers this month include that your next Minister and the church match in ways that allow that blossoming to fully occur and that you commit to not just finding a Minister that matches what you want, but to work hard to support what that Minister offers. I am confident that if you do. NVC can blossom and grow. I wish you the best living into the promise of being the Body of Christ fully animated in Nahant.

PASTOR SEARCH UPDATES From ModeratorJen McCarthy

Hello! When I announced to you that Rev Scott had resigned, I promised to keep you updated as to how we progress.

Church Council met with our Area UCC minister, Rev Alex Will Shea to discuss our options. There are two that would best meet the needs of our church. Option 1 is to search and hire an Interim Pastor. An Interim Pastor would be with us while we search for a settled pastor to lead us in worship, provide pastoral care, work with boards & committees and help keep our search on track. But an Interim Pastor cannot be considered for our Settled Pastor.

Option 2 is to have a Designated Term Pastor. A Designated Term Pastor (DTP) does everything an Interim Pastor does, but is with us for a specific time and for a special purpose. And a DTP can be considered for our Settled Pastor.

Church Council has decided to look for a Designated Term Pastor. We feel that as a church we really need to do some soul searching, and work, to discover more about our church and what path we want to go down.

The process to find a DTP is similar to finding a Settled Pastor. We will complete a Profile (similar to a resume) that the UCC will post on their website and push out to Pastors that they feel may be a good fit for NVC. The process is ongoing and will end when we feel that we have found the right person for NVC.


We will be holding discussions sessions during the process to make sure your voice, thoughts, suggestions and concerns are heard.


You may be thinking that this process sounds lengthy, and it is. Rev Scott's last service is on October 27th. The plan is find a Bridge Minister to take us through Advent & Christmas, to provide some consistency during this important time.

As the Pulpit Rock is set to go to print, I am excited announce that Council has met and is in talks with Rev. Dave VanArsdale for that position. Rev. Dave has been with NVC several times for Pulpit Coverage back in 2017. As of now it looks like Rev Dave is available to be with us from the beginning of November through the end of January 2025. Because all of the details are unfolding as I type this, more details will be shared with you soon.


